Trafalgar Square was taken over by crowds of colourful dancers to help celebrate Diwali in London.

Hosted by the Mayor of London Sadiq Khan, the K'z Dance Entertainment Ltd group based in Harrow, performed traditional folk dancing routines such as Garba and Dandiya-Raas on Sunday October 16.

Diwali is a Hindu festival with lights and marks the beginning of the financial year in India.
